


The American Community Survey The Foundation

- The nation's most current, reliable, and accessible data source for local statistics on critical planning topics such as age, children, veterans, commuting, education, income, and employment
- Surveys 3.5 million addresses and helps inform the distribution of hundreds of billions in federal funds each year
- Covers 40+ topics, and supports over 300 evidence-based federal government uses
- Three key annual data releases:
 - 1-year Estimates (for large populations, geographies of 65,000+ population)
 - 1-year Supplemental Estimates (for small populations, geographies of 20,000+ population)
 - 5-year Estimates (for very small populations, geographies down to Census Tracts and Block Groups)





ACS data are collected continuously throughout the year via:





Additional AIAN and Remote Alaska Collection Procedures:

AIAN:

- Increase overall sample size
- Emphasis on personal visit for unmailable addresses
- Attempt personal visits for all non-responses

Remote Alaska:

 2 samples/year collected over 6-months via personal visit

The American Community Survey SPT & AIANT Purpose

- Provides two new data products based on 2017-2021 ACS 5-Year estimates:
 - Selected Population Tables (SPT)
 - American Indian and Alaska Native Tables (AIANT)
- SPT & AIANT provide the most detailed social, economic, and housing data for race, Hispanic origin, tribal, and ancestry populations
 - AIANT provide more detailed tribal categories compared to SPT
- SPT & AIANT products are <u>typically</u> available every 5 years (i.e. 2010, 2015, 2021)
 - Supplement to ACS 5-Year product and 2020 Census Redistricting data

The American Community Survey SPT Population Groups

The 399 Population Groups:

- Race and ethnicity groups
- Multiple-race combinations
- Detailed race groups
 - Asian groups
 - Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander groups
- AIAN tribal groupings
- Detailed Hispanic groups
- Ancestry groups



The American Community Survey AIANT Population Groups

The 1,059 Population Groups:

- AIAN tribal groupings
- Specific American Indian tribes
- Specific Alaska Native villages

AIANT provide more detailed <u>tribal</u> <u>categories</u> compared to SPT



The American Community Survey Population Thresholds

Selected Population Tables:

Groups with at least 7,000 people nationally

American Indian and Alaska Native Tables:

Tribes with at least 100 people nationally

Geography availability in data tables:

• Geographic areas (i.e. **State**, **County**, **etc**.) must have **at least 50** unweighted sample persons from the population group of interest to be displayed in data tables

The American Community Survey AIANT – Geography

AIANT focus on providing data for as many American Indian tribes and Alaska villages as possible, therefore providing fewer geographies versus SPT:

- U.S., Regions, Divisions
- States, DC, Puerto Rico
- Alaska Native Regional Corporations
- American Indian and Alaska Native Areas

- Metropolitan/Micropolitan Areas
- Combined Statistical Areas
- New England City and Town Areas
- Hawaiian Home Lands

Compare with caution means differences between estimates may be the result of demographic changes and/or differences in question wording, processing, coding updates, or methodological differences in the population estimates used as controls.

Do not compare means there were changes in the classification of American Indian and Alaska Native tribes and tribal groupings across the time.




