

GOODS AND SERVICES DEFICIT INCREASED IN NOVEMBER 2016 (SEASONALLY ADJUSTED)

The Nation's international trade deficit in goods and services increased to \$45.2 billion in November from \$42.4 billion in October (revised), as exports decreased and imports increased.

GOODS AND SERVICES

- Exports decreased to \$185.8 billion in November from \$186.3 billion in October. Goods were \$122.4 billion in November, down from \$123.1 billion in October. Services were \$63.5 billion in November, up from \$63.2 billion in October.
- Imports increased to \$231.1 billion in November from \$228.6 billion in October. Goods were \$189.0 billion in November, up from \$186.3 billion in October. Services were \$42.1 billion in November, down from \$42.3 billion in October.
- For goods, the deficit was \$66.6 billion in November, up from \$63.2 billion in October. For services, the surplus was \$21.4 billion in November, up from \$20.9 billion in October.




GOODS BY CATEGORY (CENSUS BASIS)


Exports of goods decreased \$1.0 billion to \$121.8 billion. Capital goods decreased \$1.8 billion, reflecting decreases in civilian aircraft (\$1.3 billion) and in industrial engines (\$0.3 billion).

Imports of goods increased \$2.5 billion to \$187.2 billion. Industrial supplies and materials increased \$2.2 billion, reflecting increases in crude oil (\$0.9 billion) and in nonmonetary gold (\$0.3 billion).

SERVICES BY CATEGORY

Exports of services increased \$0.3 billion to \$63.5 billion in November. The largest increases were in financial services (\$0.2 billion) and in travel (for all purposes including education) (\$0.1 billion).

Imports of services decreased \$0.3 billion to \$42.1 billion in November. The largest decreases were in travel (for all purposes including education) (\$0.2 billion) and in transport (\$0.1 billion), which includes freight and port services and passenger fares.



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
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GOODS BY GEOGRAPHIC AREA (BILLIONS OF DOLLARS, NOT SEASONALLY ADJUSTED)



The goods deficit with the European Union increased from \$13.1 billion in October to \$14.8 billion in November. Exports decreased \$2.1 billion (primarily civilian aircraft, engines, and parts and artwork, antiques, and stamps) to \$20.9 billion, while imports decreased \$0.5 billion (primarily artwork, antiques, and stamps and organic chemicals) to \$35.6 billion.

The goods deficit with China decreased from \$31.1 billion in October to \$30.5 billion in November. Exports decreased \$0.6 billion (primarily soybeans and industrial engines) to \$12.1 billion, while imports decreased \$1.2 billion (primarily toys, games, and sporting goods and apparel) to \$42.6 billion.

The goods deficit with Canada increased from \$1.3 billion in October to \$2.7 billion in November. Exports decreased \$0.9 billion (primarily automobiles and civilian aircraft, engines, and parts) to \$21.7 billion, while imports increased \$0.5 billion (primarily crude oil and civilian aircraft) to \$24.4 billion.

EXPORTS OF GOODS BY STATE (ORIGIN OF MOVEMENT)


