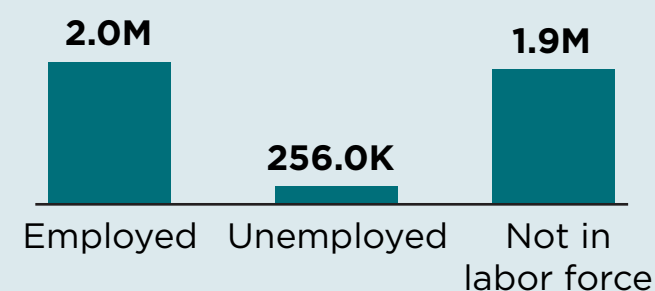

Note: Individuals may have more than one type of disability, therefore, the number of individuals in each category may not add to the total with "any disability." In this graphic, "unemployed" is defined as those in the labor force who did not have a job during the reference week and were actively seeking and able to start a job during the past 4 weeks. Also included are civilians who did not work at all during the reference week, were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off, and were available for work except for temporary illness. "Not in the labor force" is defined as the civilian noninstitutionalized population ages 18-64 who are not classified as members of the labor force. This category consists mainly of students, homemakers, retired workers, seasonal workers interviewed in an off-season and who were not looking for work, and people doing only incidental unpaid family work (less than 15 hours during the reference week).

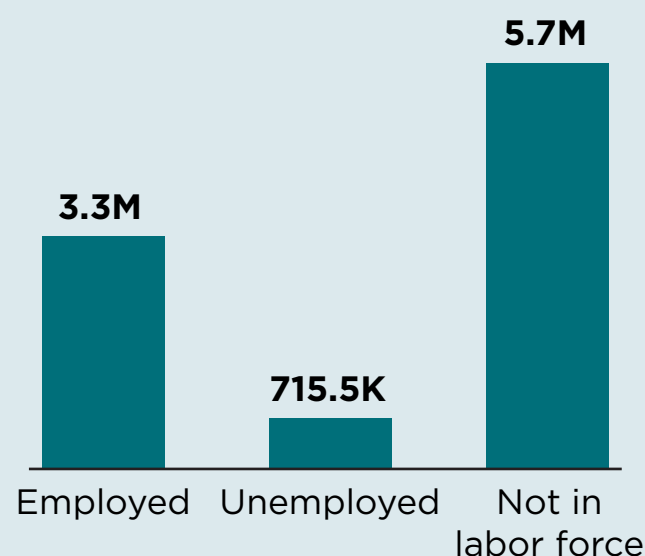

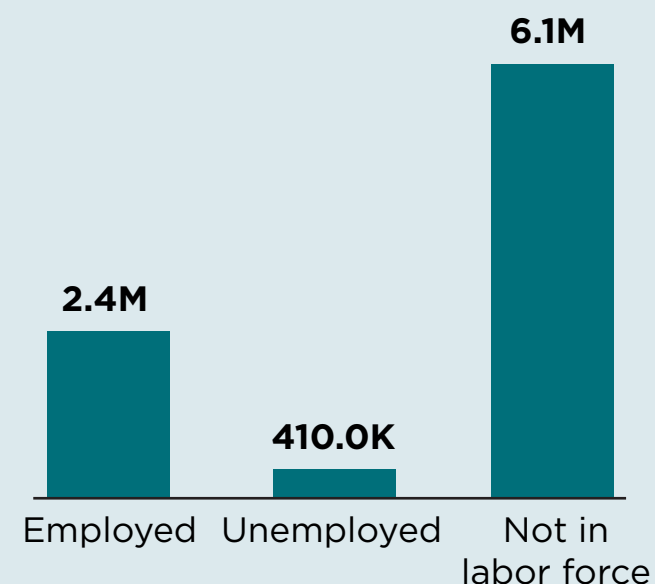
### With VISION difficulty



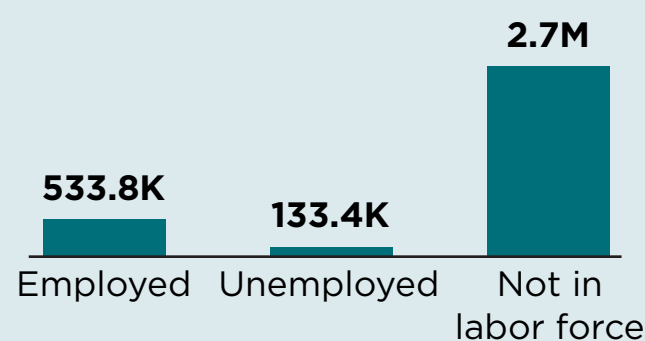
### With COGNITIVE difficulty
