

- The nation's most current, reliable, and accessible data source for local statistics on critical planning topics such as age, children, veterans, commuting, education, income, and employment
- Surveys 3.5 million addresses and informs over \$675 billion of Federal government spending each year
- Covers **40+ topics**, supports over **300** evidence-based Federal government uses, and produces **11 billion** estimates each year
- Three key annual data releases:
 - 1-year Estimates (for large populations)

Why We Ask Questions About...

Computer and Internet Use

We ask questions about the computers and devices that people use, whether people access the internet, and how people access the internet to create data about computer and internet use.

We added these questions in 2013 as a requirement of the Broadband Data Improvement Act of 2008. They help federal agencies measure the nationwide development of broadband access and decrease barriers to broadband access.



Your privacy concerns

We use your confidential survey answers to create statistics like those in the results below and in the full tables that contain all the data—no one is able to figure out your survey answers from the statistics we produce. The Census Bureau is legally bound to strict confidentiality requirements. Individual records are not shared with anyone, including federal agencies and law enforcement entities. By law, the Census Bureau cannot share respondents' answers with anyone—not the IRS, not the FBI, not the CIA, and not with any other government agency.







- Boundary changes due to annexation, disincorporation, and geocoding updates



Guidance for ACS Users



Compare across geographies and population subgroups using 2019 ACS



Compare similar period lengths (i.e., 1-year to 1-year)



Compare percentages, means, medians, and rates instead of totals whenever possible



Don't expect ACS estimates to match decennial census counts or estimates from other surveys





ACS vs. CPS

- 2019 income, poverty, and health insurance estimates from the Current Population Survey (CPS) will be released Tuesday, September 15th
- Estimates from CPS and ACS differ for a number of reasons, but trends over time tend to be similar across the surveys
- Recommendations:
 - National estimates → CPS
 - Subnational estimates → ACS


















Selected Population Profile




