## **Key Existing Census Programs for COVID**

### American Community Survey

- Provides annual data on the demographic, socio-economic, and housing characteristics of areas
- Can help users understand the potential vulnerabilities of their area based on the people that live there

### County Business Patterns

- Provides annual data on the characteristics of employer businesses in areas
- Can help users understand the potential vulnerabilities of their area based on the employer businesses that are located there and the workers of those businesses

### Nonemployer Statistics


- Provides annual data on the characteristics of self-employed persons in areas
- Can help users understand the potential vulnerabilities of their area based on the nonemployer businesses that are located there and the workers of those businesses
- Economic Census
  - Provides additional data every 5 years not available from CBP

## **Business Formation Statistics**

### Provides data on Business Applications and Formations

- Data on Total Business Applications, plus:
  - BAs from Corporations
  - High Propensity BAs
  - BAs with Planned Wages
- Estimate and Year-to-Year % change
- Geographies
  - Nation, Region, and State
- NAICS 00 (no detail)
- Weekly thru 2020 week 52



  - Nation and State by 2digit NAICS



Provides estimates of the number of individuals by the number of risk factors they are living with, categorized into three groups:

- Zero flagged risk factors
- One to two flagged risk factors
- Three or more risk factors.
- Data are shown to the Tract level


Community resilience capacity of individuals and households to absorb, endure, and recover from the health, social, and economic impacts of a disaster EXPERIMENTA such as a hurricane or pandemic. DATA When disasters occur, recovery depends on the community's ability to withstand the effects of the event. In order to facilitate disaster preparedness. the Census Bureau has developed new small area estimates. identifying communities where resources and information may effectively mitigate the impact of disasters.

Variation in individual and household characteristics are determining factors in the differential impact of a disaster. Some groups are less likely to have the capacity and resources to overcome the obstacles presented during a hazardous event. Resilience estimates can aid stakeholders and public health officials in modeling these differential impacts and developing plans to reduce a disaster's potential effects.

Individual and household characteristics from the 2018 American Community Survey (ACS) were modeled, in combination with publicly-available data from the 2018 National Health Interview Survey (NHIS), to provide tract and county level estimates.

Risk factors from the 2018 ACS include:

The Census Bureau has released the Monthly State Retail Sales (MSRS) an experimental data product featuring monthly state-level retail sales.






