MAR. 1, 2022 — The U.S. Census Bureau released today the 2019 <u>Wealth</u> and Asset Ownership Detailed Tables highlighting <u>state-level data</u> from the <u>Survey of Income and Program Participation</u> (SIPP).

These tables highlight annual household net worth estimates at the state level and are broken down by selected asset and debt categories. These measures include information on home equity and retirement accounts, as well as vehicle and credit card debt.

National Women's History Month traces its roots to March 8, 1857, when women from various New York City factories staged a protest over poor working conditions. The first Women's Day celebration in the United States was in 1909, also in New York City. More than seven decades later, Congress in 1981, established National Women's History Week to be commerorated annually the second week of March. In 1987, Congress expanded the week to a month and every year since has passed a resolution (and the president has issued a proclamation) designating March Women's History Month.

As we celebrate Women's History Month 2022, we reflect upon advances women have made over the last decade. Women have increased their earnings, education and fields of occupation, and continue to have longer average life spans than men. 
