CPS BACKGROUND

- Monthly survey jointly sponsored by the Census Bureau and BLS
- Initial interview typically in-person, follow-up interviews typically by telephone
- ~ 70,000 households a month (~60,000 in-scope cases)
- 10- to 30-minute interview
- Collected for 10 days every month
- Longitudinal collected for 8 months over a 16-month period
- Source for key labor force statistics, including the unemployment rates, labor force participation rate, and employment population ratio



CPS SUPPLEMENTS

- CPS interviews sometimes include questions on various additional topics, after the basic CPS questions are asked each month
- Use the existing CPS sample design for an affordable method of data collection
- Collected in the same interview and in the same mode as basic CPS
- 2023 had 10 supplements, sponsored by the U.S. Census Bureau and other federal agencies with data needs
- Collected in the same 10-day interview period



ASEC BACKGROUND

- Annual Social and Economic Supplement (ASEC) to the Current Population Survey (CPS)
- Largest CPS supplement
- Sponsored by the U.S. Census Bureau
- Collected since 1947, previously under the names Annual Demographic File and March Supplement
- Collected in February, March, and April each year
- Average interview length of 25 minutes



ASEC SAMPLE DESIGN

- ~ 95,000 households in sample
 - ~ 70,000 regular CPS sample from March
 - ~ 25,000 oversample cases
- Oversampled for underrepresented populations and households with children. Selected from:
 - Cases that have completed all 8 CPS interviews
 - Rotation groups not interviewed in March
- Small number of cases collected outside of the normal 10-day window
- Oversampled cases not included in the monthly labor force reports, only in ASEC reports and data

Topics

- Work experience
- Income
- Non-cash benefits
- Health coverage
- Health expenditures
- Migration

Key Estimates

- Official poverty rate
- Supplemental poverty rate
- National health insurance coverage rate


• Main reports and microdata released in September each year.





DECLINING RESPONSE RATES


- Increased rate of decline postpandemic
- Increasing challenges
 - Trouble reaching cell phones
 - Doorbell cameras
 - Government trust/privacy
- Survey response rates are in decline globally





RISING COST OF THE CPS

- Labor costs
- Travel costs
- Increased number of contacts required/harder-to-reach respondents
- Jan 2020 to Oct 2023
 - Personal visits: -23.3%
 - CAPI telephone: -2.2%
 - CATI: -36.1%





NEED FOR MODERNIZATION

- Address the trend of declining response rates
 - Lower respondent burden
 - Reach respondents who are otherwise unwilling to report/hard to count
- Manage survey costs
 - Data collection costs continue to rise rapidly as response rates decline
 - Need to reduce long-term costs to maintain sample size
 - Improve operational efficiencies



DEVELOPMENT OF CPS INTERNET SELF-RESPONSE MODE

- Census and BLS are working to add an internet self-response (ISR) collection mode alongside existing in-person and telephone collection
- Goals of new mode:
 - Reduce respondent burden
 - Reach respondents unwilling to report by other methods
 - Limit the growth of collection costs
 - Re-direct field collection resources to harder-to-collect cases
 - Improve response rates
- Target introduction of ISR mode in 2027



ADDITIONAL MODERNIZATION NEEDS

- ASEC must be collected in the same mode as Basic CPS
- ISR instruments need to be simplified for user navigation and comprehension purposes
- Census is moving to new operational systems, known as the Business Ecosystem (BE)
- Items with longstanding measurement challenges can be addressed in this development cycle




COMPONENTS OF ASEC MODERNIZATION

- Data collection
 - Internet self-response (ISR) mode
 - Content updates
- Operational changes
 - All BE systems
 - Transition to open-source software
- Introduction of administrative records into production



ASEC DATA COLLECTION TRANSITION TIMELINE



*Activities in future years are contingent on securing sufficient funding.



TESTING PLAN

- Qualitative research
 - Exploratory interviews (FY24)
 - Cognitive interviews (FY24 FY5)
- Demographic High Frequency Surveys (DHFS) testing (FY24)
 - Field test of select questions in internet mode on panel survey
- Usability testing (FY26)
- Field test (FY27)
 - CAPI and ISR modes
 - Split questionnaire design
- Edit testing (FY26 FY27)
 - Usability and field test data used to develop and test edits



AREAS OF RESEARCH

- Health insurance
 - Anchoring in current coverage to improve recall
 - Funnel design versus laundry list design for type of coverage
 - Timing for collection of details for other household members on a plan
 - Individual months of coverage vs. collapsed categories
- Migration
 - Reason for move category answer list
 - Using known geographies to display applicable answers



AREAS OF RESEARCH (CONT.)

- Income
 - Separating tips from other earned income
 - Testing new formats for amounts
 - Displaying and collecting subtype of income on initial screen for each source

• Poverty

- Augmenting child care questions
- Expanding school meals to include breakfast
- Grid formatting on select questions



PRODUCTION IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- Basic CPS intends to begin phase-in as early as May 2027
- ASEC data collection will begin in February 2028
- Phase-in plan will be determined by the basic CPS design and the availability of funding
- Expanded production sample would ensure both basic CPS and ASEC have proper bridge estimates
- Bridge file and estimates


