


History of Web based Design at Statistics Canada


- Electronic data reporting platform in place since 2003-04
- The concept of a fully functional web-based questionnaire introduced in 2008-09
- Increased demand from respondents for an electronic questionnaire, secure, reduce burden and create collection efficiencies.
- Web based questionnaire with simple edits and Blaise evaluated once data submitted.






Current Blaise Model with EQ






New EQ Development Design

- Development of a web based questionnaire with no Blaise - interviewer EQ/respondent EQ (iEQ/rEQ)
- Identical for both the interviewer and the respondent
 - Same questions
 - Same response categories
 - Same Help text
 - Same flows
 - Same edits
- Subject Matter retrieves data output in the form of standard XML files.

Drivers behind iEQ/rEQ

- Elimination of Redundant Capacity and Collection Applications (Infrastructure)
 - Fewer resources required to develop and maintain these tools
 - Development fewer platforms to build
 - Testing fewer platforms to test / integrate
- Exploit and Optimize the use of the Web based collection tool
 - Lower collection costs





Drivers behind iEQ/rEQ – Continued

- Standardization
 - Design common look and feel for all Statistics Canada Surveys
 - Tools built in help and edits
 - Systems training materials One general training for systems and shorter content specific training
 - Collection Strategies
 - Reports






Drivers behind iEQ/rEQ – Continued


- Reduced respondent burden
- Time to complete survey
- Privacy
- Green initiative
- Generate Efficiencies
 - Re-investment and analysis





Web base collection challenges

- Roles and Responsibilities
- Communication
- Change Management
- Collection Strategies
 - Number of e-reminders to use
 - Respondent tolerance to edits
 - Increasing the proportion of electronic responses received






Web base collection challenges - Continued

- New Functionalities
 - Pre-fill Authorization / Shared Secret
 - Attachments
 - Respondents who must reply for multiple surveys
 - Surveys with multiple respondents
 - Delinquent responders
 - Live updates
