



Project Management at NORC






A case against...

- Once launched, the work of field managers is centered on three groups of tasks.
 - Case review
 - Interviewer supervision
 - Administrative duties
- These tasks are governed by standard protocols and procedures.
- Standard project management techniques are either not needed or are not a good fit.
 - What would a WBS look like for an FM managing 15 interviewers tasked with completing 300 cases?



A case for...





Planning for risk

Challenge

 Field data collection efforts are susceptible to a variety of threats (staffing, weather, technology,....)

Project Management concept

Plan Risk Management

- Formal risk planning exercises
- This is now a standard part of FM planning activities on most NORC studies



Getting back on track

Challenge

 Sometimes a region falls behind production targets or has higher than expected costs.

Project Management concept

Troubled Project Recovery

- "Go to Green"
- Rolled out in late 2017 and now used across all projects



Assessing status

Challenge

 Cost and production outcomes often diverge from projections. IT can be difficult to assess when this is a problem.

Project Management concept

Earned Value Management

- Addition of Schedule Variance and Cost Variance calculations and charts to tracking reports
- Rolled out in early 2018 and now used across all staffing efforts



Setting new goals

Challenge

 Initial projections are almost always wrong. For longer projects, it can be hard to link current work to goals for where the project should be at the end of data collection.

Project Management concept

SCRUM

- Adopt a 4 week cycle for setting goals and then tracking progress
- Under development!
