ADVANCE REPORT ON DURABLE GOODS MANUFACTURERS' SHIPMENTS, INVENTORIES, AND ORDERS April 2004

(Figures in text, other than year-to-date, are in seasonally adjusted current dollars. Figures on new and unfilled orders exclude data for semiconductor manufacturing.)

• **NEW ORDERS** for manufactured durable goods in April decreased \$5.7 billion or 2.9 percent to \$191.3 billion, the Department of Commerce, U.S. Census Bureau reported today. This followed a 5.7 percent March increase. Excluding transportation, new orders decreased 2.1 percent. Excluding defense, new orders decreased 2.4 percent. Year-to-date, new orders for 2004 were 12.4 percent above the same period a year ago.

Transportation equipment, down following two consecutive increases, had the largest decrease, \$2.7 billion or 4.7 percent to \$54.5 billion. Computers and Electronic Products, down following four consecutive increases, decreased \$1.4 billion or 4.1 percent to \$31.7 billion.

• **SHIPMENTS** of manufactured durable goods in April, down following 2 consecutive increases, decreased \$1.7 billion or 0.8 percent to \$195.3 billion. This followed a 4.3 percent March increase. Year-to-date, shipments for 2004 were 10.8 percent above the same period a year ago.

Transportation equipment had the largest decrease, \$2.2 billion or 3.9 percent to 54.0 billion.

• **UNFILLED ORDERS** for manufactured durable goods in April, up eight of the last nine months, increased \$3.0 billion or 0.6 percent to \$520.4 billion. This followed a 1.3 percent March increase.

Fabricated metal products increased \$1.1 billion or 2.6 percent to \$43.9 billion.

• **INVENTORIES** of manufactured durable goods in April, up five consecutive months, increased \$1.3 billion or 0.5 percent to \$266.9 billion. This followed a 0.4 percent March increase.

Transportation equipment, up four of the last five months, had the largest increase, \$0.3 billion or 0.4 percent to \$68.3 billion. Primary metals, up six consecutive months, increased \$0.3 billion or 1.4 percent to \$18.3 billion.

- CAPITAL GOODS INDUSTRIES, DEFENSE New orders in April decreased \$1.0 billion or 10.9 percent to \$8.4 billion. Shipments decreased \$0.1 billion or 0.7 percent to \$8.2 billion. Unfilled orders increased \$0.2 billion or 0.2 percent to \$141.6 billion. Inventories decreased \$0.2 billion or 1.0 percent to \$19.5 billion.
- CAPITAL GOODS INDUSTRIES, NONDEFENSE New orders in April decreased \$1.7 billion or 2.7 percent to \$62.9 billion. Shipments increased \$0.1 billion or 0.1 percent to \$62.0 billion. Unfilled orders increased \$0.8 billion or 0.4 percent to \$223.9 billion. Inventories increased \$0.3 billion or 0.3 percent to \$105.7 billion.
- **REVISED MARCH DATA** Revised seasonally adjusted March figures for all manufacturing industries are: new orders, \$362.2 billion (revised from \$360.7 billion); shipments, \$362.1 billion (revised from \$361.3 billion); unfilled orders, \$517.4 billion (revised from \$516.8 billion); and total inventories, \$444.5 billion (revised from \$444.3 billion).

Based on advance sample. Estimates of manufacturers' shipments, inventories, and orders are subject to survey error and revision. One major component of survey error is nonsampling error, which includes errors of coverage, response and nonreporting. Since the survey panel is not a probability sample, estimates of sampling error cannot be calculated. Further details on survey design, methodology, and data limitations are contained in our most recent annual benchmark publication, Current Industrial Reports: M3-1(02), "Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders: 1992-2002."

³ The Capital Goods Industries include Nondefense: small arms and ordnance; farm machinery, and equipment; construction machinery; mining, oil, and gas field machinery; industrial machinery; vending, laundry, and other machinery; photographic equipment; metalworking machinery; turbines and generators; other power transmission equipment; pumps and compressors; material handling equipment; all other machinery; electronic computer storage devices; other computer power in machinery; electronic computer storage devices; other computer power and generators; other power transmission equipment; pumps and compressors; material handling equipment; all other power transmission equipment; pumps and compressors; material handling equipment; all other power transmission equipment; pumps and compressors; material handling equipment; and control instruments; electrical equipment; other electrical equipment, appliances, and components; heavy duty trucks; aircraft; railroad rolling stock; ships and boats; office and institutional furniture; and medical equipment and supplies.

⁴ Data on new and unfilled orders are not available for the semiconductor industry. Estimates and percent changes for new orders and unfilled orders exclude semiconductor industry data. Inventories for semiconductor industry data are included in computers and electronic products and total durable goods industries, but are not shown separately.

Survey Description

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-of-month order backlog (unfilled orders), and end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value). The M3 includes approximately 3,500 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or single-unit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 3,500 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 3,500 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source.
