

## MONTHLY ADVANCE REPORT ON MANUFACTURERS' SHIPMENTS, INVENTORIES AND ORDERS SEPTEMBER 2019

Release Number: CB 19-160 M3-1 (19)-09

**October 24, 2019** — The U.S. Census Bureau announces the September advance report on manufacturers' shipments, inventories and orders:



### New Orders

New orders for manufactured durable goods in September decreased \$2.8 billion or 1.1 percent to \$248.2 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau announced today. This decrease, down following three consecutive monthly increases, followed a 0.3 percent August increase. Excluding transportation, new orders decreased 0.3 percent. Excluding defense, new orders decreased 1.2 percent. Transportation equipment, also down following three consecutive monthly increases, led the decrease, \$2.3 billion or 2.7 percent to \$84.5 billion.

### Shipments

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in September, down three consecutive months, decreased \$1.0 billion or 0.4 percent to \$252.5 billion. This followed a 0.1 percent August decrease. Transportation equipment, also down three consecutive months, drove the decrease, \$1.0 billion or 1.2 percent to \$84.6 billion.

#### Data Inquiries

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## **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in September, down following two consecutive monthly increases, decreased less than \$0.1 billion or virtually unchanged to \$1,163.5 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent August increase. Fabricated metal products, down following three consecutive monthly increases, drove the decrease, \$0.1 billion or 0.1 percent to \$87.0 billion.

## **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in September, up fourteen of the last fifteen months, increased \$2.1 billion or 0.5 percent to \$430.3 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent August increase.

Transportation equipment, also up fourteen of the last fifteen months, led the increase, \$2.1 billion or 1.4 percent to \$145.3 billion.

## **Capital Goods**

Nondefense new orders for capital goods in September decreased \$2.1 billion or 2.8 percent to \$71.6 billion. Shipments decreased \$0.1 billion or 0.1 percent to \$74.2 billion. Unfilled orders decreased \$2.6 billion or 0.4 percent to \$690.4 billion. Inventories increased \$1.8 billion or 0.9 percent to \$194.5 billion. Defense new orders for capital goods in September decreased \$0.6 billion or 4.5 percent to \$13.2 billion. Shipments increased \$0.2 billion or 1.4 percent to \$12.8 billion. Unfilled orders increased \$0.4 billion or 0.2 percent to \$157.5 billion. Inventories increased \$0.2 billion or 1.0 percent to \$24.0 billion.

## **Revised August Data**

Revised seasonally adjusted August figures for all manufacturing industries were: new orders, \$500.0 billion (revised from \$499.8 billion); shipments, \$502.5 billion (revised from \$503.0 billion); unfilled orders, \$1,163.6 billion (revised from \$1,162.9 billion) and total inventories, \$695.8 billion (revised from \$695.9 billion).

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## **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

Figures in text are adjusted for seasonality, but not for inflation. Figures on new and unfilled orders exclude data for semiconductor manufacturing.

“Virtually unchanged” indicates that the change is less than 0.05 percent for a percent increase or decrease.

### **Description of the survey**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau’s Manufacturers’ Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey, which is a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code. This survey provides statistics on a calendar-month basis for manufacturers’ value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-of-month order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). Data published from the M3 survey are based on a panel of approximately 5,000 reporting units that represent approximately 3,100 companies and provide an indication of month-to-month change for the Manufacturing Sector. These reporting units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or single-unit manufacturers in 92 industry categories, which are combined into 65 publication levels due to the small monthly panel size. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of the reporting units in the M3 panel effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The companies for which shipments data are currently reported or imputed in the M3 survey represent approximately 64 percent of the total value of shipments for manufacturing establishments in the 2012 Economic Census, and these companies include almost two-thirds of the manufacturing companies with \$500 million or more in shipments in the 2012 Economic Census. The companies for which shipments data are currently reported in the M3 survey represent approximately 57 percent of the total value of shipments for manufacturing establishments in the 2012 Economic Census. Statistics based on the M3 panel differ from the results that would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. The M3 panel is not based on a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source. Any corrections will be published in the full report. Corrections received after the full report will be released in the next month’s advance report. Any revisions made later than two months will be reflected in the annual benchmark publication. Defense Capital Goods include : small arms and ordnance, communications equipment, aircraft; missiles, space vehicles, and parts, ships and boats, and search and navigation equipment.<sup>5</sup> Estimates and percent changes of shipments and inventories for the semiconductor industry are included in computers and electronic products, and all other applicable aggregate totals. Estimates and percent changes for new orders and unfilled orders exclude semiconductor industry data.
