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Full Report on Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Orders December 2009

Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in December, up eight of the last nine months, increased \$3.7 billion or 1.0 percent to \$370.4 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau reported today. This followed a 1.0 percent November increase. Excluding transportation, new orders increased 1.2 percent.

Shipments, up six of the last seven months, increased \$7.0 billion or 1.9 percent to \$383.1 billion. This followed a 1.6 percent November increase.

Unfilled orders, down fifteen consecutive months, decreased \$7.4 billion or 1.0 percent to \$716.7 billion. This was the longest streak of consecutive monthly decreases since the series was first published on a NAICS basis in 1992. This followed a 0.7 percent November decrease. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 5.46, down from 5.65 in November.

Inventories, down following two consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$0.3 billion or 0.1 percent to \$495.0 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent November increase. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.29, down from 1.32 in November.

New Orders

New orders for manufactured durable goods in December, up following two consecutive monthly decreases, increased \$1.6 billion or 1.0 percent to \$169.0 billion, revised from the previously published 0.3 percent increase. This followed a 0.4 percent November decrease.

Machinery, up three of the last four months, had the largest increase, \$1.5 billion or 6.6 percent to \$24.3 billion.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods increased \$2.1 billion or 1.0 percent to \$201.4 billion.

Shipments

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in December, up four consecutive months, increased \$5.0 billion or 2.8 percent to \$181.7 billion, revised from the previously published 2.9 percent increase. This followed a 0.8 percent November increase.

Transportation equipment, up three of the last four months, had the largest increase, \$1.8 billion or 4.2 percent to \$45.8 billion.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods, up eight of the last nine months, increased \$2.1 billion or 1.0 percent to \$201.4 billion. This followed a 2.2 percent November increase. This increase was led by petroleum and coal products, which increased \$1.2 billion or 2.8 percent to \$44.7 billion.

Unfilled Orders

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in December, down fifteen consecutive months, decreased \$7.4 billion or 1.0 percent to \$716.7 billion, revised from the previously published 1.2 percent decrease. This was the longest streak of consecutive monthly decreases since the series was first published on a NAICS basis in 1992 and followed a 0.7 percent November decrease.

Transportation equipment, down fourteen of the last fifteen months, had the largest decrease, \$7.8 billion or 1.9 percent to \$409.7 billion.

Inventories

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in December, down twelve consecutive months, decreased \$0.5 billion or 0.2 percent to \$302.8 billion, unchanged from the previously published decrease. This followed a 0.2 percent November decrease.

Fabricated metal products, down fourteen of the last fifteen months, had the largest decrease, \$0.3 billion or 0.8 percent to \$36.7 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, up three consecutive months, increased \$0.2 billion or 0.1 percent to \$192.2 billion. This followed a 0.8 percent November increase. Petroleum and coal products drove the increase, up \$1.2 billion or 4.0 percent to \$31.2 billion.

By stage of fabrication, December materials and supplies decreased 0.1 percent in durable goods and increased 1.8 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process increased 0.1 percent in durable goods and 0.8 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods decreased 0.5 percent in durable goods and 1.4 percent in nondurable goods.

Survey Description

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-of-month order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 4,300 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or single-unit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 61 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 4,300 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 4,300 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source. Any corrections will be published in the full report. Corrections received after the full report will be released in the next month's advance report. Any revisions made later than two months will be reflected in the annual benchmark publication.

As of the Benchmark release, shipments for the semiconductor industry will no longer be shown separately, but will be included in the computers and electronic products, and all other applicable aggregate totals.
