## Release Details

- National and state populations by single year of age, sex, race, and Hispanic origin.
- County populations by five-year age groups, sex, race, and Hispanic origin.
- Puerto Rico Commonwealth and municipio populations by age and sex.


## Modification of Race Responses

- Race modification reconciles 2010 Census race categories with official Office of Management and Budget (OMB) race categories (used in estimates processing).
- No changes to race modification edit since Census 2000.
- Responses that include Some Other Race (SOR) are modified to include only OMB races.
- In 2010, $97 \%$ of SOR alone population was Hispanic; modification does not affect Hispanic origin.

## July 1, 2011 Population Estimates: National Characteristics

## Age Distribution - Adults

- The median age for the nation was 37.3 , an increase of 0.1 since Census 2010.
- There were 196.3 million working age adults (ages 18-64), representing 63.0 percent of the total population (an increase of about 2 million).
- About 13.3 percent were age 65 or over and 1.8 percent were age $85+$.


## Age Distribution - Children

- The total number of children under age 5 was 20.2 million ( 6.5 percent).
- The number of elementary school-age children (ages $5-13$ ) was 36.9 million (11.8 percent).
- High school-age children (ages 14-17) were estimated at 16.9 million (5.4 percent).

## Hispanic Origin

- Hispanic population increased by 3.1 percent to 52.0 million, making it the largest minority group.
- Hispanics represented 16.7 percent of the total population in 2011.


## Race Alone or in Combination

- Asians were the fastest-growing race group, increasing by 3.0 percent to 18.2 million.
- Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders (NHPI) grew 2.9 percent to 1.4 million.
- American Indians and Alaska Natives (AIAN) increased by 2.1 percent to 6.3 million.
- Blacks or African Americans increased 1.6 percent to 43.9 million.


## Minority Population

- The minority population includes any person who is not in the category of nonHispanic white alone.
- Overall, the total minority population in the nation was 114.1 million people.
- This accounted for 36.6 percent of the total population.


## Majority-Minority Status

- The proportion of children age 0-4 who are minority was 49.7 percent, an increase from 2010, when it was 49.0 percent.
- More than half the population (50.4 percent) under age 1 was minority.


## July 1, 2011 Population Estimates: State Characteristics

## Males and Females

- There were only 10 states where males made up the majority of the population on July 1, 2011.
- Alaska had the highest percentage of men at 51.9 percent, followed by Wyoming (51.0 percent), and North Dakota (50.6 percent).
- The District of Columbia had the highest percentage of women of any state at 52.7 percent, followed by Rhode Island (51.7 percent), and Maryland (51.6 percent).

Note: The District of Columbia is considered a state equivalent.

## Age for Puerto Rico Commonwealth

- The percent age 65 and over in Puerto Rico was 15.2 percent.
- In contrast, 5.9 percent of the population was under the age of 5 .
- The overall median age for Puerto Rico was 37.4.

## Age for Puerto Rico Municipios

- Hormigueros was the municipio with the highest percent age 65 and over, at 21.5 percent.
- In contrast, Peñuelas was the municipio with the highest percent under age 5, at 7.0 percent.
- Hormigueros had the highest median age (42.0) among the municipios, followed by Rincon (41.4) and Vieques (40.8).

## Majority-Minority Counties

- More than 11 percent (348) counties were majorityminority in 2011.
- The highest percent majority-minority counties were:
- Maverick Co, Texas (96.8 percent)
- Webb Co, Texas (96.4 percent)
- Wade Hampton Census Area, Alaska (96.2 percent)
- In total, nine counties became majority-minority since April 1, 2010.


## Majority-Minority Counties

- Nine counties that became majority-minority since April 1, 2010:
- California: Sutter Co and Yolo Co
- Georgia: Quitman Co
- New Jersey: Cumberland Co
- New Mexico: Colfax Co
- Texas: Lynn Co, Mitchell Co, Schleicher Co, and Swisher Co
