- Click on the Geographies box to open the Select Geographies page.

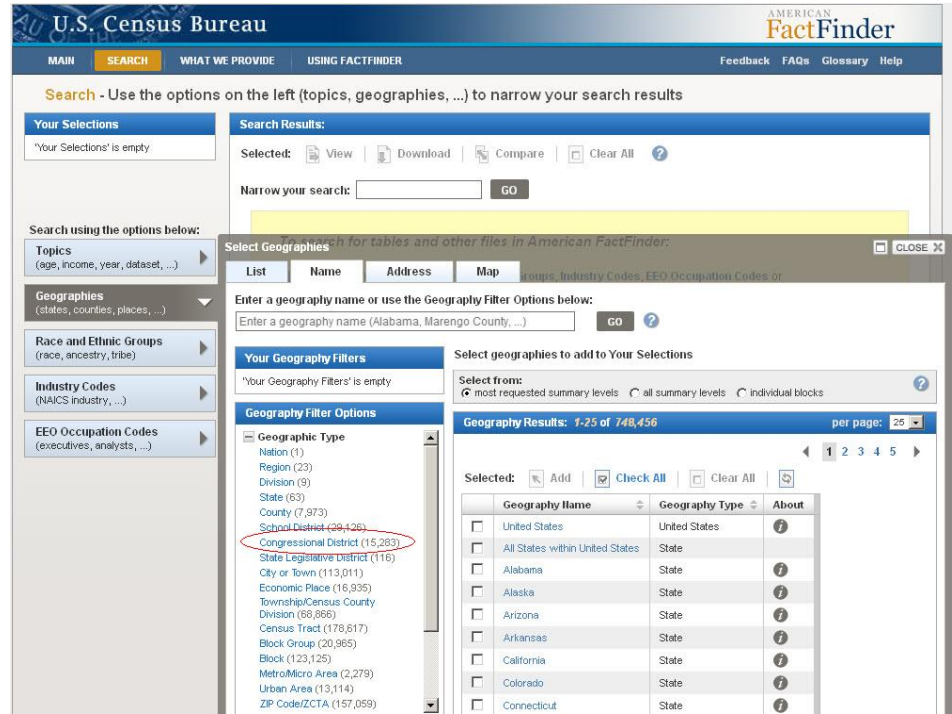
